

Employment Status: Full-Time

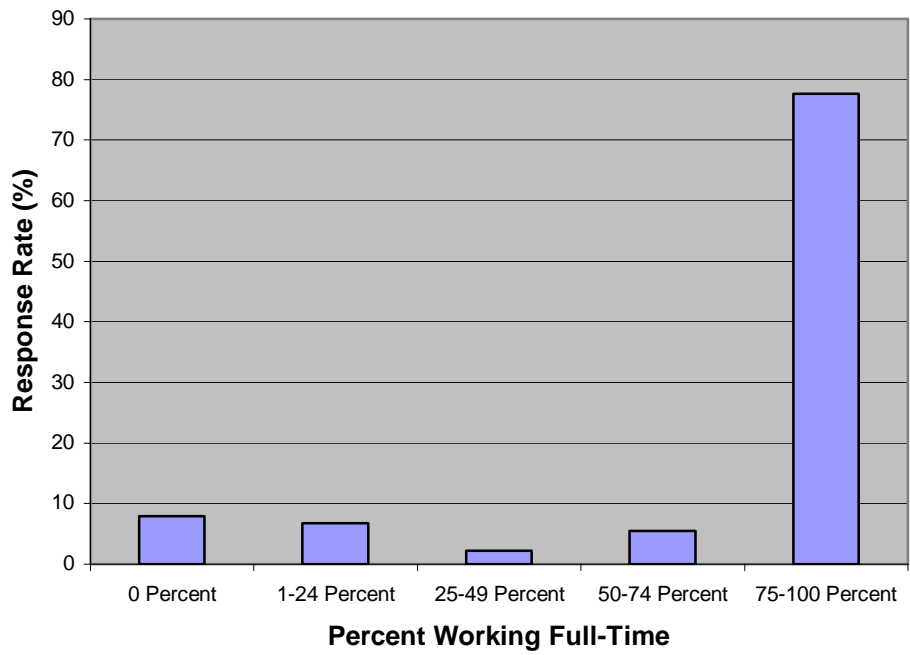


Figure 1. Percentage of employees that are full-time across all occupations

Employment status provides information on the extent to which an economy is utilizing its labor force. As a general rule, a fully employed economy will have a greater share of its labor force working full-time. Employers were asked, for instance, what percentage of their employees worked full time. According to the survey, over three-fourths (77.6 percent) of those who responded indicated having between 75 and 100 percent of their employees working full time. Only 5.5 percent indicated the number to be between 50 and 74 percent, 2.2 percent indicated it was between 25 and 49 percent and 14.7 percent said it was less than 25 percent. (Table 5/Figure 1)
